#### Draft 2021-2022 Work Plan for Lower Duwamish Waterway Roundtable

Draft v. 2-18-21

#### WORKPLAN

Below is a draft workplan for Roundtable meetings in 2021 and 2022. This workplan is intended for LDW Roundtable Steering Committee review. As Figure 1 below shows, this work plan is intended to build the capacity of Roundtable members, so that they can provide substantive feedback on the 30% design of the cleanup for the Upper Reach in 2022. The 30% design is also called the preliminary design.





The table below shows a draft meeting plan related to the anticipated site milestones in 2021-2022 (see Attachment A for a list of those likely milestones), release of documents related to those milestones, and the likely role of the Roundtable. Roundtable meetings may also include information about Superfund topics that are not directly tied to milestones. See Attachment B for example topics, as identified in a 2018 Roundtable meeting.

#### The topics best suited to the Roundtable are:

- 1. Meaningful: Topics that matter to Roundtable members and their caucus members. The topics will be shared in a way that can be understood by people with non-technical background.
- 2. Timely: The topics are aligned to be relevant to the site schedule.
- 3. Actionable: Topics where the Roundtable can give input to EPA before a site decision, and cleanup-related topics that benefit from Roundtable members engaging with each other.

Please note this is a draft workplan, intended to help the Steering Committee visualize how Roundtable meetings can complement site milestones and opportunities to give input to EPA. The Facilitation Team and EPA would like your feedback on meeting timing, the proposed milestone-related topics, and additional topics for EPA consideration.

#### This Roundtable workplan includes:

- 1. Meetings: Formal convenings of the Roundtable that follow the Roundtable's agreed-upon operating procedures and provide the Roundtable members with the opportunity to share perspectives with the EPA.
- 2. Webinars: Informal Presentations provided by EPA on a single topic that are optional education opportunities for the Roundtable members and members of their caucuses. Webinars may include Question & Answer sections but will not include opportunities to give input to EPA.

# Attachment A: Anticipated Site Milestones in 2021-2022

The details below regarding anticipated milestones at the Lower Duwamish Waterway Superfund Site are background information that informs the draft work plan starting on page 2. The milestones are contingent on other project events, and dates may change.

## Explanation of Significant Difference (ESD) for carcinogenic polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (cPAHs)

- 1. January 2021: EPA releases a draft ESD. EPA leads period where public input is welcomed for EPA to consider.
- 2. February 2021: Public Question and Answer Session, open to Roundtable members, to help members of the public ask questions to support their input to EPA.
- 3. February 2021: End public input period.
- 4. TBD: EPA integrated public input into the Explanation of Significant Difference (ESD).
- 5. TBD: Final approval of Explanation of Significant Difference (ESD) modified if necessary (5month process?)

### **Remedial Design**

- 1. February 10, 2021 Data evaluation report first draft
- 2. March 12, 2021 first draft Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) amendment for Phase 2 work
  - a. Structures how to assess what is under them?
  - b. Dredge areas and depth sampling
  - c. Any additional sampling to outline action areas
  - d. Biological testing
  - e. Geotechnical data
- 3. Approximately June August 2021 Field work duration and timing to be determined
- 4. Lab results and tiering decisions (if any)
- 5. January 2022 Data report
- 6. May 2022 draft Data Evaluation Report
- 7. August 2022 Remedial Design 30%

# Carbon Amendment Pilot Study Year 3 Results and Next Steps

- 1. January 18, 2021 Year 3 data report is DUE TO EPA 90 days after monitoring event complete (includes SPME, sediment, tissue, and benthic taxonomy data) (not Roundtable materials)
- 2. January 27, 2021 Preview results and findings. Discussion with EPA and Ecology on Pilot Study data and initial findings
- 3. March 23, 2021 Year 3 Monitoring Report DUE TO EPA (90 days after all validated data become available)
- 4. Next Steps EPA will decide whether to get more data, incorporate carbon amendment into Enhanced Natural Recovery (ENR) areas in the Upper Reach, or to not incorporate carbon amendment into Enhanced Natural Recovery (ENR) for LDW.

# Attachment B: Additional Superfund-Related Topics for Roundtable Consideration

Below are topics that EPA identified as potentially relevant for Roundtable discussion. Some topics are related to the overall Superfund process others are directly or indirectly connected to Remedial Design and/or Remedial Action.

- Jobs and training (e.g., Superfund Job Training Initiative)

- Fishing (for issues that fall outside the Institutional Control program)
